The Cawthon couple

Peter and Teresa foster the growth of the indigenous church in Mexico. They are also recent “empty nesters”, having raised two children, Charlsie and Pete, on the mission field. Both children are married, giving the Cawthons five grand kids.

Peter and Teresa Cawthon have 26 years experience as missionaries to Mexico. For the last 18 they have served in the state of Oaxaca. This state has a tighter cluster of people groups than anywhere else in the Americas. Many of the over 200 people groups are unreached with the Gospel. They reached out to many villages that did not have a church. God has given them much fruit for their labors!

Teresa’s parents were farmers in California, where she learned to drive on a tractor. Peter’s father was a Houston banker. “Both of us had a climactic encounter with Jesus Christ in our college years. We realized how much we had hurt Him and others by our lives. Our goal was to serve Him wherever He sent us.”

The Lord called Peter and Teresa to show the people of Oaxaca what He is really like, not what their traditional religion claims. Peter and Teresa also host medical/dental and construction teams to serve the people of remote indigenous regions. This opens doors to areas that are otherwise closed to presenting the Gospel.

In 1992 Teresa had a vision of a library for Christians, with mobile capabilities for the villages. Eleven years after the vision, their living and dining rooms were full of books, bookshelves, a desk and computer. Their prayer for a suitable location for the library was answered and they are now able to provide the first lending library having Christian materials. Remote village churches, as well as churches in the local area can now get access to Christian materials to help them grow in knowledge.

Our mission is to be a vital force in proclaiming the Gospel to the unreached people groups of Mexico plus train nationals to better serve Christ. This is done both through hosting short term mission teams and managing a Spanish Christian lending library.

The Cawthons are involved in church-planting, building homes, well-drilling, handing out food and school supplies, dramas, testimonies and building relationships. They work with a number of native speaking pastors and support the work they are doing in their villages. Another big part of their ministry is Mission Trips. They are always happy to share with people what God is doing in Oaxaca and allow them to take part in ministry.

Oaxaca is unique. Oaxaca has the most unreached people in the Western Hemisphere. It is filled with isolated people groups who have their own dialect and often have never heard the gospel. Many times there are 1 or 2 Christians out of thousands of people in a village. The goal is to minister to the material needs as a means of opening doors to their spiritual needs. In everything the Cawthons do they are looking for the opportunity to demonstrate Christ and lead them to Him.



GOALS: 1. We'd like to host 12 short term teams per years. 2. We'd like to plant 50 churches in the next 5 years. 3. We'd like to see the library grow to over 700 members this year.

CHALLENGES: We love being on the mission field- the hardest part is being away from our family.

NEEDS: Continued financial support, more workers; especially dentists, optometrists, doctors; and prayer intercessors, and continued good health.

PRAYER CONCERNS: That our vehicles would stay in good working order, that the Lord will lead us to the right "new" areas to spread the Gospel, that the Lord will protect our marriage and give us both daily a new renewed love for each other, and that we will have a new hunger and thirst every day for the Lord and His word.



Adventures in Odyssey-Lent Study

There were approximately 8-12 children who attended the Lent Study on a weekly basis.

Each Adventure in Odyssey program was paired with a coordinating mission project. Some of the mission project included writing letters to congregation members who are homebound and children who are sick, sewing stuffed pillows/stuffed animals to children who are diagnosed with incurable diseases, and sun catchers for meals on wheels.


Easter Egg Hunt at CPC!

Filling plastic Easter Eggs is no small task! Just ask the kids of CPC. As part of their service project during the Lenten Study, they stuffed about 400 of them!


The Hunt was On!




Calling all good and faithful servants!




be served! Sigh up in Fellowship Hall so we know how much we need to feed the masses.
