

I write this column looking out my study window at a cloudless blue sky, grass that almost needs mowing, and a forsythia bush bright enough that Moses would come over for a look. Heather, my Northeast Ohio native wife has said, "It's disorienting to see so much sun!" More than one long-time Geauga County resident has told me, "You sure are getting spoiled this year. You better not get used to this." Amen and amen.

The biblical word for describing such things is wonder: "You are the God who works wonders" (Ps. 77:14). "The Lord displayed before our eyes great and awesome signs and wonders" (Deut. 6:22). The story of Scripture gives repeated witness to God's capacity to astonish with more life than people reasonably expect. Improbably, Egyptian slaves are led to freedom. Inexplicably, lame ones walk at Jesus' touch and the blind receive their sight. Unaccountably, the terror of the cross is overtaken by the wonder of the empty tomb, and the Crucified One breaks bread with disciples as the Lord of heaven and earth.

It has been a month since the shooting at Chardon High School. The terror of that day lingers, as it surely will for some time; recovery from such trauma cannot happen quickly. Yet there are also ways in which the terror is being overtaken by wonder. We have seen astonishing generosity expressed, remarkable resilience among students and faculty, a transformation of school hallways to reflect less of a house of mourning and more of a house of hope.

Scripture has a word for these realities as well:

resurrection. Holy Week trains us to live with resurrection wonder. This is no rose-colored vision. That humanity executed God's Son, as we remember on Good Friday, reminds us that human beings are capable of the most terrible things. Yet the empty tomb of Sunday announces that death and devastation do not have the last world. Resurrection tells us that where a future seems impossible, God makes things new.

Easter always matters. It is the church's greatest day because it is God's greatest victory. For us who have known the darkness of death, the word of resurrection will shine brighter and more wondrous this year. The resurrection gospel is that God isn't just *telling* us life is new—God is *making* it to be so. We are never in a position to know quite what God will do. We can just be ready to receive it and, as on a miraculously colorful Northeast Ohio spring day, stand in thankful awe.


