Paul surely had the ancient Olympic-style games in mind when, at the end of his life, he said to Timothy, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (2 Tim. 4:7). He spoke of his life filled with "purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance, ...sufferings" (3:10), things that are well known not just to elite athletes but also to people and churches sold out on living the salvation life in Jesus. The church is a body that seeks beauty and excellence not dissimilar to a swimmer or gymnast, only the standard after which the church strives isn't a time or score but a life: Word made flesh Jesus.

Starting on **September 9**, in response to input from the congregation in the spring, our Sunday morning format will see some changes that will help us live more excellent lives in Jesus (see article on pp. 4 & 5). During the 9:30am hour there will be Sunday School for Adults and Youth, as well as a time for learning faith hands-on for children K-5th Grade. At 10:30am we will have worship and Sunday School for preschool-5th Grade, doing things the same as now, only beginning one hour later.

When I watch track I want to run. When I see gymnastics I want to leap. Soccer makes me want to play. And when I sit with others in Sunday School, attending to Scripture and wise ones in the faith, I want to give more of myself to performing the way of Christ in the world. I look forward to seeing how God forms us through this new pattern together.

NEW SUNDAY MORNING FORMAT

BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 9

In April the Session began a process of evaluating our Sunday morning ministries of worship, fellowship, and education discerning what is most important to Christ Church in these and whether any changes might make our life more vital. Though conversation with church committees and groups, and congregational response forms gathered in the Sundays of May, we learned important things about the church.

We learned Christ Church values:

- Worship with engaging preaching, children's involvement, and a diversity of music—some preferring "traditional," others "contemporary," and many liking a blend
- Fellowship time that expresses our unity, welcomes others, and has a spirit of celebration
- Education for adults through Bible and topical study, and small groups, with regular focus on the spiritual life
- Education for children and youth grounded in learning God's Word and growing in relationship with Jesus Christ

Many also said they would prefer a later service time, still having one worship service in which we're all together as a church family. Based on this input and its own discernment, Session believes that a modified Sunday morning format will better help us be the church that God is leading us to be.

SUNDAY MORNING PROGRAMMING, BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 9

SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR ADULTS AND YOUTH

9:30 - 10:15 a.m.

Adults and youth will have their own Sunday School gatherings, with adults meeting regularly for Bible study, seasonal and topical classes, and youth coming together in their own class for continued growth in knowledge and faith.

DISCOVERY TIME $(K - 5^{TH})$

9:30 - 10:15 a.m.

While adults attend class, there will be hands-on activities for children—crafts, small mission projects, etc.—and also food and fellowship. Different from the traditional Sunday School time that will remain concurrent with the worship service, this gathering will focus less on content and more on experiencing the life of faith together.

WORSHIP WITH CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL (K – 5TH)

10:30 a.m.

Though it will start an hour later, the worship service will remain the same as present. Worship will be the same in style and format, with children K-5th grade typically beginning with families in worship and going to Sunday School after the Moment with Children. Middle and high school youth will worship with the church for the entire service.

COFFEE HOUR/FELLOWSHIP TIME

11:30 a.m.

The coffee hour and fellowship gatherings will be after worship, the same as now.

The Session believes this new format not only expresses what is important to CPC, but also that it gives us ability to grow to be more excellent disciples, making disciples of all ages, worshiping God and loving one another. More will be said in coming weeks about the programming for this format, particularly for adult and youth Sunday School and children's Discovery Time. If you have questions or feedback, Pastor Matt or a member of the Session will be pleased to share conversation with you.


