Christ Presbyterian has supported us since 1986(!!)

My parents moved to Chagrin Falls when I was in college - around 1976 or 77, something like that, so that is where I go when I go "home."

We first served in New Caledonia, with a stop in Papua New Guinea on the way, for jungle camp (after 2 years in Switzerland for French study for Kent). We lived in New Caledonia for 4 years, where Jonathan was born, we trained Mother-Tongue Bible translators, and published the first Scripture in the language of Fa Ceta (there are about 30 Melanesian languages spoken in New Caledonia.

After New Caledonia, we went to Fuller in Pasadena, and got Masters Degrees in Intercultural Studies / Bible translation.

Then we moved to Cameroon, Africa, where we spent another 4 years, lived in the jungle village of Nkongnine, and analyzed the language in order to make an orthography (alphabet) to write the previously unwritten language of

Mkaa'.

For the past 13 years, we've been working at the International Headquarters just south of Dallas, Texas. And that's what all our prayer letters have been about lately!

We are also in a time of transition - we have had a difficult few months. We're praying that the Lord will guide us clearly into our next areas of ministry, and that he will provide. We'll be officially sending more about that soon.



In the meantime, Jonathan is graduating from Texas A&M this weekend with his Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Design, in the school of architecture. He wants to take a break from school, find a job and pay off loans, and get some work experience. Pray that he find a job. Libbie is successfully completing her freshman year with straight A's this semester at Southern Methodist University, double majoring in clarinet performance and music composition.

I'm consulting with folks as they plan workshops to train trainers here in Dallas, and for the first time in Mexico in Spanish. I am also consulting with someone working in India with programs teaching Indians to train Mother-Tongue Bible translators. Fulfilling stuff!

Kent is finishing up work on computer programs to speed up the publication of language survey reports and creating a Language and Culture Learning Resource for Bible translation teams.
