# What's Working

Dear friends,

When new members join our church, they respond to three questions:



Who is your Lord and Savior? Answer: Jesus Christ is my Lord and Savior.

Do you promise to be his disciple, study his Word, and to show his love? I do.

Will you share in the life and mission of this church, and seek the fellowship of the church wherever you may be? I will.

Beyond this, people have to make no specific pledge of involvement in a small group, tithing, or participation in mission. But I'd like to suggest that a covenant of membership might include something like the following:

I acknowledge that I am a sinner in need of God's saving mercy;

I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God who lived, died, and rose again for me; I trust in him alone for my salvation.

In response to God's love and with a desire to be a faithful steward of the spiritual gifts, material possessions, physical energy, and time he has given, I agree:

to walk in Christian love:

to exercise care for the other members of the church;

to attend worship services faithfully;

to uphold the needs of the church and of its ministries and mission in prayer;

to study and apply the Scriptures to the whole of life;

to seek a place of active service in the church;

to contribute regularly, as the Lord provides and directs; to the financial support of the ministry entrusted to the church;





to endeavor by word, action, and prayer to bear witness to Jesus Christ; to respect the leaders whom God raises up to shepherd this congregation; and to maintain the peace, unity, and purity of the church.

No list is perfect, but these cover what we understand to be the whole range of living in the body of Christ. They address the issue of stewardship, or our responsible use of all God has entrusted to us.

As we make decisions about our stewardship commitments this year, I encourage you to move toward a tithe of ten per cent of your income to the church, if you're not already doing that. If you are, then pray about what new step of faith the Lord might be asking you to make this next year. Why do we do that?

Because we don't want our resources to control us; because we want the satisfaction of seeing the Lord work through us; because we want to see our congregation become all God wants it to be; because it helps us "put off" the old self and "put on" the characteristics of Christ (Col. 3:9, 12);

because we learn to trust God and move beyond fear as we give; and, most of all, it's a way of saying thanks to God for all he's done for us.

What was a fun trip you took recently? We saw the Biltmore in North Carolina & we saw Brian & his family in Boston.



### Serving the City Mission

This is an outreach program that is part of the Men's Ministry, and it began in 2008. One of the goals for the group was becoming more involved in reaching out beyond the walls of our church. We wanted to do that by getting more involved in the local community, and also trying to reach out to the inner city of Cleveland. Once we contacted several ministry programs, we chose to volunteer at the Cleveland City Mission. We would be serving meals to the homeless men who are in the Crossroads Ministry program. It has proven to be a very rewarding way to serve food for, sometimes, up to 60 homeless men.

At an orientation in 2008, we learned how to get involved. It was obvious how God was working through the facility and volunteers. It has changed people's lives as they came to know Jesus through these programs. So we signed on! In 2008, we agreed to serve meals one Wednesday every other month.

The first month, we rallied about 8 men to volunteer. It was a success! At that point, we decided to, not only serve dinner, but also eat dinner with them. It was quite a blessing to sit with these men and learn their life stories. It was humbling to learn how they became homeless. 
