Chimes



My dear sisters and brothers,

This week we have seen the world at its worst. Our youth have known what no young person should know. Our televisions are

telling a story that should never need telling. We are offering prayers of the sort no one should ever have to offer. We are bringing to God questions that will not be satisfactorily explained. The shots fired by a student at Chardon High School on Monday have taken three lives and wounded two more, and the event is hitting us all. We who speak of the "brokenness of the world" have seen just how broken it is. And more than just seeing it, we *feel* it.

It goes without saying that the Chardon High School shooting will be with this community and church not just weeks but months, and in ways even years. One of the pains of being human is that severe damage done—to bodies, to souls, to memories—cannot be undone or truly healed this side of God's lasting new creation. There will be no quick fix. Healing may come, but it will not be without scars.

Our faith tells us that God knows this, even as deeply as God's own self in his Son, Jesus Christ. John's Revelation vision that proclaims God's victory over sin, evil and every form of destruction depicts the risen, reigning, heavenly Christ as "a Lamb, *looking as if it had been slain*" (Rev. 5:6a). And when the risen Christ first appeared to disciples he still wore execution marks on his hands and his side. The church is the body of Christ in the world as a people that lives with wounds. The wounds of the church, this community, our world, were in full view Monday night as we gathered to pray in our worship space. On that night, even though we had seen the world at its worst, we were being the church at its best: throwing our lives upon God and around each other; inviting others in to share in our trouble and begin to hope for redemption; giving witness not just to the horror we knew, but to the love of God which, in the face of it all, is sturdy enough to bear us, bind us together, and create a future into which we may walk.

We who have seen the world at its worst may now be the church at its best. This area is only starting to determine what healing and going forward will mean, but I am convinced that this church will be part of God's purpose to mend lives and give people strength to walk into the future with hope.

The day before the shooting our church gathered for an installation service in which we declared the church's gospel ministry is, in the words of the liturgy from our *Book of Order*, "to lift the people's vision toward the hope of God's new creation" and "to support... people in the disciplines of the faith in the mist of the struggles of daily life." For our youth, for our friends, for our schools, for our leaders, for each other, we may now be such a church even as we ourselves struggle and grieve. We may be people of the God whose love "bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (1 Cor. 13:7).

By the grace and strength of the Lamb that was slain, may it be so.
